Sports and Venues

General Information

The GOC Sport and Venues Department is working hard to ensure that athletes and coaches will experience a high quality sporting event in Athens, in June 2011.

The Competition Schedule and Venue Locations by sport can be found on the official Athens 2011 web site www.athens2011.org

Getting ready for the SOWSG Athens 2011, the GOC will organize Test Events for the majority of the sports. Sixteen (16) Test Events will take place in two periods: The test events of the 1st period have taken place from May 30 until June 3, 2010, during the Special Olympics Hellas National Games, and concern the sports of Aquatics, Athletics, Badminton, Basketball, Bocce, Cycling, Football, Gymnastics, Handball, Powerlifting, Table Tennis and Volleyball, while the rest of the test events will be organized individually, from May until October 2010 and concern the sports of Sailing, Judo, Kayaking and Bowling.

Venue and Sport of the Month: Tennis
The venue for the Special Olympics Tennis competition is the Olympic Tennis Centre within the Athens Olympic Sports Complex (OAKA). The venue was purpose-built for the Olympic and Paralympic Games and is located in the suburb of Maroussi, north of the Athens City Center. The distance between the venue and the Special Olympics Village is approximately 30km and the estimated travel time by bus is 30-40 minutes. The Olympic Tennis Centre consists of 16 outdoor hard courts split to a Centre Court, a Show Court, ten (10) match courts and four (4) practice courts. The surface of all courts is Deco Turf II, same as the surface used at the US Open.

Events Offered:

Singles, Doubles, Mixed Doubles

Registration Instructions:

Athletes may participate in a maximun of two (2) events.

Sport Uniform/Equipment:

- Each athlete will be responsible for providing his/her own tennis racket and will be required to wear traditional tennis clothing.
- · The athlete must wear appropriate tennis shoes. Black sole shoes will not be allowed on the courts.

Points of Emphasis - Rules Conditions:

- Short set scoring will be used for this competition. Sets are the 1st player to win 4 games, while leading by 2 games (4-1, 4-2, etc.).
- A 7-point tiebreak is played at 4-4. Athletes play 2 out of 3 sets, with a 7--point tiebreak played in lieu of a 3rd set.

Updates and Important Technical Information per Sport

Bocce: Surface

The Bocce surface of the Indoor Hall to be used for the Special Olympics Hellas 2010 National Games and the SOWSG Athens 2011 is carpeted with approximately zero pile. It is being laid over the venue's floor, which is a rubber surface (used for different sport events such as Handball etc). The combination of these surfaces will have as a result a game of average paced speed.

Football: Equipment, Uniform & Shoes
For the Football tournament of the SOWSG Athens 2011, the uniform/equipment requirements are as follows:

- Each player shall wear a number (on the back)
- No part of the uniform may contain advertising
- Delegations shall bring their own kit (shirts, shorts, socks, footwear, shin guards) for the tournament.
- FOOTBALL SHOES FOR 5 A-SIDE: OUTDOOR SPORTS SHOES WITH ANTI-SLIP (obligatory)

Kayaking: Water Type

For the first time during the SOWSG Athens 2011, the swimming test for Kayaking will be conducted in the sea and not in a swimming pool, as during the previous Games. The Schinias Sailing Academy, a venue right next to the Olympic Rowing & Canoeing Center, will host both kayaking and sailing swimming tests on the same date. Moreover, athletes will be allowed to wear Personal Flotation Devices during the swimming test.

Sailing: Boats

The type of the boats to be used for Sailing in the SOWSG Athens 2011 are the following:

Level 1: 420, Level 2: 420, Level 3: Laser Bahia, Level 4: 420, Level 5: Laser 4.7 or smaller & Optimist





Games Services

Transport:

GOC's Transport Department aims to deliver several transportation systems during the SOWSG Athens 2011, each comprising various levels of services to all Games constituents. Our ultimate objective is to provide a comfortable and efficient service.

Delegations will be transported by a fleet of approximately 350 buses provided by OASA (Organization of the Athens Public Transport). There shall be three main transport malls in operation, in OAKA (Athens Olympic Sports Complex), Village and Hellinikon. These buses will also be used for the delegations' transport to and from the Opening & Closing Ceremonies.

All Star fans will be provided with a fleet of 150-200 private cars (sedan type) with dedicated drivers, in order to meet this group's transportation needs. In certain cases and in accordance to the standards set by the Games Agreement, we will also arrange police escort or motorcade.

MVP's: Games motor pool will be in operation for this group of guests.

HOD's: A designated car and a driver will be provided for each Head of Delegation

Technical Delegates & TO's: Motor pool transportation will be used for this group.

Family members: The public transportation system shall be available free of charge for those carrying a valid credential.

Host Town Program: Transport will provide the necessary number of coaches for transferring the Delegations from the airport (or other point of entry) to their Host Town destination and then to the Special Olympics Village.

Village: The Special Olympics Village (SOV) is the home of the Athletes, coaches and Delegates during the SOWSG Competition period. The overall scope of the Special Olympics Village Operations is the provision of fully serviced accommodation to all residents, including medical services, catering, sports information etc.

Our objective is to provide a residential environment that is safe, comfortable, convenient, stress-free and friendly to enable athletes to enjoy their stay and leave with a clear, lasting and positive memory of Athens and Greek hospitality.

Logistics: We will deliver effective logistics services including receipt, storage, tracking, transportation and distribution of all equipment and materials required for venue set-up and venue demobilization.





Non - Sports Programs and Events

Accommodation

The SOWSG Athens 2011 are expected to attract, beyond the approximately 10,000 athletes and coaches, a crowd of over 40,000 people, including spectators, family members, technical crew, journalists and VIP's. The GOC's Accommodation Department is preparing and organizing to service all these constituent groups of people during the games in the most effective and convenient way in order to meet the standards required by SOI. All Star Fans, MVP's will be accommodated in selected hotels, all of which are located in the center of Athens and are very close to most of the Competition Venues. Moreover, the Organizing Committee is currently working on finding suitable accommodation of various star ratings, for the technical delegates, journalists and all the media groups participating in the Games. In the light of the overall hospitality program and due to the fact that the demand for accommodation during the SOWSG Athens 2011 will be very high, SOI in consultation with Special Olympics Hellas, has appointed an official travel agency in order to provide the best acommodation service. As a result, spectators, family members and general public will be given the opportunity to book hotels of their preference from the ATHENS 2011 official web-site. Moreover, variety of additional tourist options such as car rental, excursions, cruises etc. will be offered.

Even though in the Olympic Games, Apollon, as the god of Sun, is present only in the Torch lighting ceremony after being called by the High Priestess, in the Special Olympics of Athens, Apollon will be present and will spread its light to all our athletes, while they will be competing in the sports fields,







Non - Sports Programs & Events

Family Services

The aim of the GOC Family Services Department is to provide a safe and inviting environment for the visiting family members, so that they can enjoy not only the sports competition but also the variety of opportunities that this event has to offer. Due to the fact that the expected number of family members is significant, accurate planning is needed. For this reason, the delegations are asked to name a National Family Coordinator who will liaise with the GOC's Family Services Department especially during the preparation process. Particularly Family Coordinators will be responsible for the dissemination of information and updates on a national level; they will mediate between the local family members and GOC in matters regarding registration, travel information, materials distribution and any other subject that may arise concerning their stay in Athens and attending the Games. Healthy Athletes Program

ATHENS 2011 Offers Free Medical Checkup for all athletes!

Athletes participating in the SOWSG Athens 2011 can receive free medical checkup under a program called Healthy Athletes which is conducted in collaboration with Special Olympics International. The program, developed in 1996 and globally implemented since, is designed to help Special Olympics athletes improve their health and fitness, leading to enhanced sports experience and improved well-being. The 7,500 athletes from 185 countries and regions at the SOWG Athens 2011 will be encouraged to receive health assessments which span across six areas, namely: Fit Feet, FUN fitness, Healthy Hearing, Health Promotion, Opening Eyes, and Special Smiles.

Fit Feet

Fit Feet was developed in collaboration with the American Academy of Podiatric Sports Medicine to evaluate and screen foot and ankle deformities of athletes and to provide education in proper footwear and care of the feet and toes.

FUNfitness

During a FUNfitness screening, volunteer physical therapists, assistants, and students assess the flexibility and functional strength of Special Olympics athletes' muscles as well as overall balance. The program also provides "take-away" educational materials for Special Olympics athletes and information for families and coaches about the importance of and methods to improve flexibility, functional strength and balance in sports performance and activities of daily living.

Healthy Hearing

Healthy Hearing provides a screening for the athletes, and notifies athletes and their coaches if follow-up care is needed. This program also provides corrective (hearing aids) and preventative (custom swim earplugs) services where possible, and studies the prevalence of hearing loss in athletes competing in Special Olympics events.

Health Promotion

Health Promotion focuses on educating athletes about healthy lifestyles and the facilitation of healthy choices. It mainly focuses on nutrition and exercise, as well as bone health, smoking cessation and sun safety using interactive educational activities and motivational information to encourage behaviour change.

Opening Eyes®

At Opening Eyes events, Special Olympics athletes receive extensive vision and eye health tests; refraction for those requiring further screening; prescription eyeglasses, if needed; prescription protective sports eyewear, if appropriate; and referral for follow-up care.

Special Smiles®

At a Special Smiles event, dental professionals provide oral screenings; oral health education and personal prevention products; and individually fitted sports mouth guards, if needed, for those athletes competing in contact or high-risk sports.

The host country and the host city at a glance....

Greece will host the biggest sport event for the year 2011, the 2011 Special Olympics World Summer Games, inviting humanity to join the wonderful winning world of Special Olympics.

Greece is a country of beautiful contradictions. A constant journey in time, from the present to the past and back again. It is the birthplace of the Western civilization where philosophy, democracy and the Olympic Games were born. Greece has always been a crossroad of various cultures and civilizations. While being here one feels the grandeur of history and discovers the evolutionary process of thought, influence and experience.

Greece is located in south-eastern Europe, on the southern end of the Balkan Peninsula; it lies at the meeting point of three continents – Europe, Asia and Africa. The total area of Greece is 131,957 km2 and consists of three main geographic areas: a peninsular mainland (that extends from the region of Central Greece in the South to the region of Thrace in the North) being the biggest geographic feature of the country, the Peloponnese peninsula that is separated from the mainland by the canal of the Corinth Isthmus, and around 6,000 islands and islets, scattered in the Aegean and Ionian Sea, most of them grouped in clusters, that constitute the unique Greek archipelago. Crete, Rhodes, Corfu, the Dodecanese and the Cyclades are some of the famous and popular islands and island clusters in Greece.

The climate of Greece is predominately Mediterranean: mild and rainy winters, relatively warm and dry summers and generally extended periods of sunshine throughout most of the year. More information about the climate of Greece can be found in the Hellenic National Meteorological Service (www.hnms.gr).

The capital of Greece is Athens; Athens is a modern European city with more than 4 million inhabitants. Among European cities, Athens is the oldest and the one with the longest history. This history is still evident in the buildings and monuments of today's Greek capital. Athens is situated in the prefecture of Attica and extends to the peninsula that reaches up to Central Greece. It is surrounded by mountains northwards and eastwards, and the Saronic gulf southwards and westwards. The sun is shining over Athens all year round. The climate is one of the best in Europe, with mild winters and very hot summers, ideal for tourism. Dominating the Athenian landscape, the Acropolis is unsurpassed in its beauty, architectural splendor and historic importance. The Parthenon is situated on the highest part of the Acropolis. It was built between 447 and 437 BC and reflects the values and objectives of the Athenian State at the time. It was here that modern democracy began its early foothold.
